THE LOWER PLATE on the distributor can ground out if the ignition cable is screwed in too tight. You can prevent this by gluing a 3%" x ½" piece of bicycle inner tube to the opposite side of the contact point on the bottom plate.


Used inner tubes are readily available from most any bike shop.


When cut into thin slices, bicycle inner tubes also make a heavy duty rubber band. Θ
