
**The Naperville Father's Day Car Show** is Saturday, June 19. All going will meet at the Colonial Retaurant. The group will leave at 8:15 am

# **TECHNICAL DISCUSSIONS:**

Alan Petrik is rebuilding his steering box/ shaft. The sector shaft is out of round and the worm gear is worn. So, there is considerable rebuilding needed.

Gene Egert installed a steering column that was rebuilt at Bratton's. The worm gear was pressed on at the supplier. The group discussed the pros and cons of doing the worn gear installation onto the column by oneself. It's not easy and can destroy the shaft.

#### Tiny Tips Classic From MARCA Members

**PUTTING IN COTTER PINS,** by getting the castelated nuts aligned with the hole in the bolt, can be difficult for those of us whose eyesight isn't what it used to be or who are working in poor light. But a little preparation will make cotter pin assembly much easier.

Before you get out your wrenches, reach for a fine-tooth file with at least


one good corner. I use a small, triangular file

to put a shallow, but very visible cut on the thread end of the bolt, running parallel to the hole for the cotter pin.

This makes it much easier to line up the notches in the nut with the fine cut on the end of the bolt

and have the hole in line for the cotter pin.

Bend the long arm of the cotter pin over the end of bolt to conceal the mark.  $\Theta$
