CECHNICAL DISCUSSIONS:

Ed Danley talked about the installation of modern style no drill shocks he bought from Brattons. He said the instructions were not very clear but worked through it with patience. The results were great.

Dan Manola brought in a brake service shaft with metal wedded on the ends and then turned

on a lathe to the correct dimensions. The group discussed the pros and cons of using slip over sleeves to compensate for the worn surfaces.

Lindy Willimas talked about lubing springleaves. It requires jacking up the car to open the spaces between the leaves and using a thin item like a hack saw blade to "butter" the surfices between the leaves with good lubricant.

Gene Egert reported that the reason his test engine didn't start at the tech session was because the distributor's condenser was bad.

TIDY TIPS From MATCA Members

TFOUND A GREAT WAY to make it easier to fill up my Model A with modern gas pumps. I screwed together two regulation hockey pucks, using two 2.5" countersunk screws, then drilled a centered ^{13/16}" hole.

Together, the pucks are the right height to permit the tank to nearly fill before the automatic shutoff engages. Being made of rubber, the pucks do not scratch the finish.

Before drilling, I attached the two pucks. I then used a succession of slightly larger drill bits until I could use a ¹³/₁₆" bit. (As I drilled, I used only a vise to secure the pucks.)

The hole does not have to be precise, so long as it is large enough to permit the nozzle to pass through.

In my experience at gas stations, the pucks are a perfect height for today's automatic shutoffs. Θ
