TECHNICAL DISCUSSIONS:

Its time to check your cooling system and drain it or fill it with antifreeze before the cold weather comes. Do this to prevent getting a cracked water jacket!

Ray McMahon sent an email showing a Model A gas tank pealed opened at the top to demonstrate how the internal baffels are arranged. Its becomes obvious that trying clean out sediment and corrosion is difficult. The best method is to open the tank at the top clean it out and seal it and then reweld the cover. Considering the expertise required this is not a typical do it yourself job.

Paul Herbert is having speedometer problems. He took it out of the car and attached the cable to a drill to see if it moved freely. Paul is seeing no movement. However in the car the meter oscillates in wider and wider arcs. It looks like the internal movement is faulty.



As soon as I removed the


