TECHNICAL DISCUSSIONS:

Based on **Gar William's** talk last month on glass balance beads, **Bill Johnson** installed the balance beads in his tires from a kit he got from *Snyder's*. Bill said they work fine. He was able to pour them into the innertubes easily enough with the stems out.

Ken Jagodzinski reported a probable problem with his front wheel bearings. They seem to be scored. He asked about the removal of the bearings and races and adding grease. Lindy Williams suggested that he get help from members to inspect them before proceeding.

Nick Mazzarella discussed a problem he is having with the mounting of his left rear fender. The fender fits well except the hangar is too wide. Trying to expand the inside of the fender will eventually crack welds. He asked for advice. **Gar Williams** suggested cutting a piece out of the hanger and rewelding the ends to make it fit the fender. That seems like the best option.

Gene Egert, Tom Eklund, Ray McMahon, and Tom Wiggin attended the Model A Day in Gilmore, MI. There were a lot of vendors there and many items were available at good prices.


Illinois Vehicle Code Amended

An act to amend Section 3-804 of "The Illinois Vehicle Code"—was approved September 29, 1969, and was signed by Governor James Thompson on Aug. 22, 1983. Because of the amendment, antique vehicles may now carry license plates displaying their model years as long as the valid and current plates are car-

OLD CARS

The amendment follows: "Any person who is the registered owner of an antique vehicle may 1 display a historical license plate -from or representing the model year of the vehicle, furnished by such person, in lieu of the current and valid Illinois antique vehicle plates issued thereto, provided that valid and current Illinois antique vehicle plates and registration card issued to such antique vehicle are simultaneously carried within such vehicle and are available for 'inspection."_

Illinois Bill to Expand Antique Vehicle Usage Signed into Law



Success in Illinois! Governor J.B. Pritzker signed into law SAN-supported legislation (HB 2548) to allow "Antique Expanded Use" vehicles to be driven without limitation for two additional months. Expanded-use Antique Vehicles are defined as being more than

25 years old or a bona fide replica and were previously limited to traveling to and from auto shows, exhibitions, service stations, and demonstrations during the colder months (November 1 through March 31), but could be driven without limitation during the warmer months (April 1 through October 31). The new law expands the months without driving limitations to March 1st through November 30th. The law went into effect on Aug 20. 2021.
